

HANSON COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD  
MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS  
Friday, May 7, 2021

Commissioner Kjetland called the meeting of the Hanson County Drainage Board to order on Friday, May 7, 2021 with members Bumgardner, Fox, Schoenrock and Waldera present. Don Huber, Drainage Administrator was also present.

Motion Schoenrock, seconded by Bumgardner to approve the agenda.

Motion Waldera, seconded by Fox to approve the meeting minutes from April 20th.

No citizens input.

Motion Waldera, seconded by Bumgardner to approve permit #21-19 for Dan Brown to replace existing tile in the NE4 NE4 of 10-103-57. All voted aye, motion carried.

Motion Fox, seconded by Schoenrock, and carried, to approve permit #21-20 for New Elm Springs Colony to replace a 24" culvert with a 36" culvert and widen the driveway 8' to 10' in section 32-101-58 as the following conditions have been met. Project does not affect government property, does not drain a fish or wild life lake, does not impact a meandered lake, does not affect another county, does not convert noncontributing land to contributing land, erosion potential is minimal, no impact to water quality and supply, ag production will remain the same, environmental quality remains the same, aesthetics will be maintained, fish and wildlife values remain the same, receiving watercourse does have sufficient capacity, drainage is a reasonable improvement and aid to the normal and natural system, drainage is a reasonable artificial drain system, the amount of water to be drained is reasonable, the design and physical aspects of the drain are acceptable, impact of sustained flow is normal.

John Schallenkamp presented a permit on behalf of Mark Mabee to tile in section 15-104-59. As the permit only has landowner signatures to a blue line waterway, and not to a named waterway, a motion was made by Fox, seconded by Schoenrock to table the permit until the needed signature can be obtained. The States Attorney verified this needed requirement before the permit can be approved.

Motion Waldera, seconded by Fox to approve the following permit for Hanson County to replace existing culverts on County roads. Permit #21-21 at 416<sup>th</sup> & 263<sup>rd</sup> St.; permit #21-22 at 418<sup>th</sup> & 266<sup>th</sup> St.; and permit #21-23 at 41714 252<sup>nd</sup> St. Schoenrock abstained, all others voted aye, motion carried.

Motion Schoenrock, seconded by Bumgardner, and carried, to approve permit #21-24 for Hanson County to add an additional 15" culvert at 261<sup>st</sup> St. and 416<sup>th</sup> Ave. as the following conditions have been met. Project does not affect government property, does not drain a fish and wildlife lake, does not impact a meandered lake, does not affect another county, does not convert noncontributing land to contributing land, erosion potential is minimal, no impact to water quality and supply, ag production will improve, environmental quality will improve, aesthetics will be maintained, fish and wildlife values will not be affected, receiving water course has sufficient capacity, drainage is a reasonable improvement and aid to the normal and natural system, drainage is a reasonable artificial drain system, the amount of water to be drained is reasonable, the design and physical aspects of the drain are acceptable, impact of sustained flow is acceptable.

Several drainage projects done without permits were discussed. Huber will contact the landowners to complete the required permits.

As there was no further business before the Board, a motion was made by Fox, seconded by Bumgardner to adjourn meeting. All voted aye, motion carried.
