ORDINANCE NO. 5

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF FIREWORKS AT THE LAKE HANSON BEACH AND PARK AREA IN HANSON COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA

BE IT ORDAINED BY ... HANSON COUNTY:

- A. Definitions. Terms as used in this ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, shall mean:
 - (1) "Fireworks"-any item or device designed primarily to produce visable or audible effects(a) by the combustion, or (b) by the generation of pressure through decomposition, heat, or other means, of a substance or mixture of substances contained in the item or device.
 - (2) "Lake Hanson Beach and Park Area"-that area platted as "Recreation Parks No. 1" it, which is a part of Lot 4 in Section 21, Township 101 North, Range 58 West of the 5th P.M. in Hanson County, South Dakota, and which is commonly know as the Lake Hanson Beach and Campground area, and contains approximately ten(10) acres, more or less.
- B. Prohibition. No person shall light, set off, fire, or use any fireworks of any kind, at any time, in the Lake Hanson Beach and Park Area.
- C. Penalty. Any person found guilty of violating the terms or provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a maximum penalty of a fine of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or thirty (30) days jail sentence in the Hanson County jail, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- D. Severability Provision. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid, for any reason, or the applicability thereof to any person or circumstances held to be invalid, the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance and the applicability thereof to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected thereby.
